Muthusami Kumaran, Ph.D. Associate Professor of Nonprofit Management & Community Organizations, University of Florida, USA and Deok-Hyeon Kim, of World Environment and Island Studies Institute, Jeju National University, suggest an idea "Establishing a 'Jeju Environmental NGO Resource Center' can cover various environmental issues and best practices for organizational management capacity training for environmental NGOs" to Jeju people through their collaborative articles, "Organizational Management Needs Assessment and Capacity Building for Environmental NGOs: An Analysis of Environmental NGOs on Jeju Island to Promote Operational Efficiency and Sectoral Effectiveness".

According to them, "Protecting and preserving the natural and environmental treasures of Jeju Island is, eventually, the collective responsibility of the people of Jeju, all levels of the government, corporate and the environmental NGO sectors. Jeju Island has a vibrant environmental NGO sector with about 80 NGOs providing a variety of active environmental services. All efforts and services to conserve the environment of Jeju Island for the benefits of future generations need to be galvanized within the overarching environmental governance where all three sectors actively participate and make collective decisions within the three key elements of sustainable development: people, planet & profit. The key ingredient for promoting networking and collaborative opportunities between environmental NGOs, government entities and corporations is to improve their trust on one another. Given the current status of environmental NGOs - governments - corporations relations, it will take time to develop such trust, but if small measures are undertaken, mutual understanding & respect between the leaders of NGOs, government and corporations will grow and eventually result in mutual trust. So, establishing a 'Jeju Environmental NGO Resource Center' where environmental NGO leaders can attend expert presentations on various environmental issues and best practices from other island states/cities across the world. Such resource center can also provide organizational management capacity training

for environmental NGOs, as many of them lack key management skills highlighted in this article."

Island Act 2021: A Righteous Social Healing
of Jeju 4.3 Grand Tragedy through Jeju
Massacre Consultation.**

It is significant that Chang Hoon Ko PhD, President, World Association for Island Studies proposes to the public "Korea Jeju 4.3 Human Rights and Peace Island Act 2021 as A Righteous Social Healing of Jeju 4.3 Grand Tragedy Through Jeju Massacre Consultation'.

As Jeju people try to make an effort to find its place for 4.3 Grand Tragedy in the Sun, they will contribute to world peace beyond the Jeju 4.3 Tragedy. It will be a starting point that Jeju people propose to U.S. Congress "the Korea Jeju Human Rights and Peace Island Act 2021." It was meaningful that Jeju National University students suggested their idea about enactment of Jeju 4.3 Reconciliation Act to U.S. Congress at the meeting of both office of Congressman Mark Takano and Congresswoman

Judy Chu on May 1, 2019. As we recognize it will be possible for us to do Jeju Massacre Consultation in U.S. Court based on Jeju 4.3 Reparative Justice, if it happens in the U.S. It would be a historic achievement in the Human Rights and Democracy in 21st century similar to the Civil Liberty Act 1988 to Japanese Internment cases and the Hong Kong Human Rights and Democracy Act 2019 to Hong Kong democratization.

Korean KyongnoDang as a Humane Model

Im, A. Duck Im, Ph.D, Koh, H. C. Ph.D. Datunashivili. MD and Kim, C. Yon say about Korean Kyongnodan as a Humane Model at their collaborative model :

"Koreans considered themselves as a critical link between the past and future and not an autonomous individual of now, in contrast to what many westerners emphasized and modern Koreans are beginning to think. This study is to apply the "Asian Jeong Nang silver model" as a spirit of "happiness and dignity of the elderly " as the basic policy for the aging Baby Boomers. The way of life of Jeju Haenyeos was similar to the typical life style of retired Baby Boomers, who had been devoted to social contribution until the last minute, returning expert knowledge to the community. That's why Haenyeo community was chosen as a typical archetype for a new silver model development. Cross Cultural Ageing Initiative (CCAI)'s purpose is to promote international exchange and collaboration between Korea and United States for research, education and service for the aging population. To bring together the best practices of the East and West, involving all the stake holders of the wider community such as participants in "the 2021 Global Ageing Network(GAN) Biennial Conference : East meets West: Approaches to Healthy Ageing and Wellness in both Seoul and Jeju Island in S. Korea September by GAN and GAN Korea. In particular, the upcoming "Silver Tsunami" in Korean society shows the necessity of welfare models for Korean baby boomers who have retired as highly educated professionals."

Peace Island Village Care Models Through Jeju World Peace Academy.

Lee, Kyung-won, Ko, Chang Hoon, Song, Shi-woo, Kim, Deok-hyeon, Im, Sejun and Kang, Ko, Won-Seop, Kwang-sik try to suggest Peace Island Care Village Models Through Jeju World Peace Academy to the public:

"We reach at conclusion that title of the 2021 GAN in Jeju Korea is "This Is Peace Island Care." We have two reasons: one is that as we have basic assumption " Jeju Island should be Peace Island Care in Asia Pacific region," at village level beyond trauma of Jeju 4.3 Grand Tragedy (1947-1954), we try to illuminate Peace Island Care Village models to heal its trauma at grass roots level by both participants and villagers through students of Jeju World Peace Academy for 4 years (2016-2019) such as Jeju 4.3 Buchon-ri, Dongkwang-ri, Ora-ri and Chungsoo ri assisting its resilience beyond their atrocities. It is important for us to connect the Peace Island Care models with other care models globally. So, we introduce three village ones to audience at the Toronto GAN Biennial conference : This Is Long Term Care 2019. It says "Transforming Ageing Together, a global approach to This Is Long Term Care 2019."

The WEIS is no longer "scratching at the surface". Rather the journal is getting to the heart of the matter". Indeed, as the world is coming to know more about island people, cultures, islands are becoming important actors on the global stage in an age of World Environment.
